## **Special Reports**

## Jeff Lewis, NRCS

- Lewis handed out the weekly Snow Report SNOTEL- Snow water equivalent as percent of median. This year the upper green is 79% in April 2024 compared to 133% in 2023.
- Working on contracting and have spent all the funding for this year.
- May have future work on the repair of the People's Canal (WWDC and BOR funds)

# Dave Kimble, USFW

- Reported on partners for the Fish and Wildlife program. Kimble works for the private land's habitat program of the Fish and Wildlife program, which is voluntary and specific to wildlife habitat.
- Reported on a funding agreement USFW has with WACD. Kimble does individual agreements and works with other conservation districts, but now has a broader agreement.
- Working with and has a project with the Ramsay Ranch on building fences to make riparian pasture so the cattle won't have access/limited use.
- Working on earth plugs and building some dams on the tributaries on Trout Creek which are head cutting, (private land). Dam construction is planned for 2024.
- Kimble explained the plugs: Taking material off the bank to make a plug to stop the head cutting.
- WY Wildlife Natural Resource Trust is going through Trout Unlimited. (50k)
- USFW Partner Fish Wildlife Program would be via SWCCD (if approved).
   (28,200k)
- WACD sends the fund, plus 2% of project costs to SWCCD. SWCCD pays invoices to landowner and contractor on the project.
- Dickinson would like more information and explanation due to the listing on Trout Creek and how it addresses the listing. Kimble will send staff a summary/breakdown of the project.

# Rick Breininger, Associate Supervisor

Working on a back yard sanctuary, for birds/monarchs and animals.

# **Unfinished Business**

Bitter-Killpecker Creek Update and Actions <u>Drop Structure</u>

Burris said access to the site is still an issue.

## Water Quality Monitoring/BKWAG Meeting

Staff handed out information on a WDEQ status report on chloride for Bitter Creek. The EPA study is complete, but Ron Steg WDEQ, needs permission to release it.

From Steg: "EPA completed a draft analysis to determine the natural background concentration of chlorides and it was inconclusive. I'll have to ask EPA if I can release the study. It is likely that what we are observing is a combination of both natural and anthropogenic chloride sources (which are ubiquitous throughout the watershed)."

The BKWAG Meeting will be held Tuesday, May 14, at the White Mountain Library. A virtual option will be available for participants.

## WDA Water Quality Grant RFP

WDA advertised the request for proposal (RFP) for the 2025-26 fiscal biennium Water Quality Grant Program. This first RFP is open for projects addressing impaired waters listed on the WDEQ Integrated 305(b) and 303(d) reports. Deadline is May 24.

A <u>motion</u> was made by Jean Dickinson, seconded by Stephanie Anderson, to approve and submit the 20k WDA water quality grant to WDA. Motion carried.

# Community Enhancement Grant

A <u>motion</u> was made by Jean Dickinson, seconded by Henry Bliss, to un-table the Community Enhancement Grant for further discussion. Motion carried.

Burris spoke with Weed & Pest and found it is the right chemical application. Burris has concerns with the reputable application of the chemical. Burris will call John Freeman about his concerns.

The District received one grant application from the Green River Greenbelt Task Force, regarding chemical treatment for Russian Olive/Tamarisk trees along the river corridor.

# Department of Revenue - Boundary Map

Staff was directed to get an estimate from Kent Felderman, JFC Engineering, regarding a legal description for the boundary to satisfy Dept. of Revenue. The District is in compliance with the Department, but the map was rejected.

A <u>motion</u> was made by Jean Dickinson, seconded by Stephanie Anderson, to approve the estimate for Kent Felderman for \$850.00 to prepare a certified legal description of the current Sweetwater County Conservation District's boundary in accordance with the map of same, as previously submitted to the Wyoming Department of Revenue. Motion carried.

## Rocky Mountain Power Funding

Burris spoke with Ron Wild, Rocky Mountain Power (RMP), regarding funding and was told about grants and funding. Rocky Mtn Power has a corporate 10k grant and a \$1,000. grant. Staff has not heard back from Rocky Mountain Power that was submitted by email for the \$1,000. grant. Staff will look into the RMP grant online. (10k)

A <u>motion</u> was made by Jean Dickinson, seconded by Stephanie Anderson, to ratify the \$1,000.00 request to Rocky Mountain Power. Motion carried.

## Jackalope Wind Project Draft MOU

A <u>motion</u> was made by Jean Dickinson, seconded by Stephanie Anderson, to approve the Jackalope Wind draft MOU with legal's comments. Motion carried. Staff will work with legal on submitting the MOU with suggested edits. (D. Bettencourt primary and J. Dickinson alternate)
